Eyon Misr Program (Egypt Eyes Program) for educational enhancement

POP believes that every child has the right to safe, quality education. This program focus specifically on the most vulnerable groups, such as girls, children with disabilities, and those living in areas of poverty and from low-income families. POP strives to increase access to education for girls, increase inclusive education for children with disabilities, and increase access to education during emergencies, as for the refugees.

Caring for child education will reduce street children, child marriage, early pregnancy, and poverty.

Eyon Misr is a chain of schools, child creativity centers and educational enhancement programs aiming to develop students into good effective citizens, thinkers, innovators, and leaders, who can coexist and collaborate in a diverse world.

The Coptic Church embarked on an ambitious initiative to build schools in Egypt, as well as extending its hand to support the education of refugee children in Cairo, through a school that has been established specifically for this group. Following the footsteps of Jesus Christ, the Coptic Church is also extending support to African countries and has contributed to the establishment of the first Coptic technical school in Burundi.

The POP has also supported different education-related activities in Egypt including various language programs; Eyon Misr Child creativity Center; a scholarship program for education abroad; and education grants.





A- Eyon Misr Schools in Egypt

With the enormous increase in the Egyptian population reaching over 109 million. The need for more new schools is increasing day after day. Eyon Misr chain of Schools owned by the Coptic Orthodox Church operates with the aim of providing quality education throughout Egypt to all Egyptians

The guiding principles for these schools are as follows:

- All Egyptians are raised together in an environment of love and acceptance to the other
- The provision of quality education that fosters creativity and builds a whole person with skills for life.
- An Equal opportunity ensuring gender-equality.



Eyon Misr School, Dessert Area

Since the establishment of POP in 2013 and up to date, POP has successfully contributed in the establishment of 11 schools in seven different governorates in Egypt. These schools are established to be sustainable entities that are managed by partners at the diocese level. According to the most recent counts, Eyon Misr Coptic schools offer education to 6,032 students today

This year we have completed and opened a new school in the chain of Eyon Misr Schools:

9. Eyon Misr – St. Stephan Language School, Naqada, Qena (September 2023)
It's a National School "English Language", from KG till secondary stage with a total capacity of 924 students with 3 classes in each grade, 22 students in each class.
The school was built in a very slum village in Naqada were no languages schools exist.
The school started operation this academic year 2024/2023 with 225 students.

Eyon Misr schools still under construction:

10. Eyon Misr Rakoty School, Alexandria (Expected to start operation September 2024) In 2023, POP started the construction of a new school Rakoty Eyon Misr School in Om Zagheo, Alexandria Governorate. It is a national English Language school and will operate with classes from KG to High School with total capacity of 1700 students with 3 classes in each grade, 40 students in each class. The school is under construction and is built on a total land area 4589 meters, and consists of a basement, ground floor, and four repetitive floors. The school is located in a very slum area, with high population density raising the need for more schools in the area.

11. Eyon Misr Amoun School, Suhag

The school located in Akhmim, Nagaa Fadel Suhag, Suhag Governarate. It is a national school divided into two sections English Language and Arabic and will operate classes from KG to High School with total capacity of 650 students, the school consist of 28 classes were 23 students in each class. The school is under construction and is built on a total land area 2713 meters, and consists of a basement, ground floor, and four repetitive floors.



B- The Sudanese Refugees School in Cairo "The African Society School for Primary and Secondary Education"



Due to the current situation in Sudan more refugees are coming to Egypt and are in need for full support, the school works to save the African refugee community in Cairo, especially the Sudanese community, from the darkness of ignorance and mental blindness, and to lead youth and children towards a bright future and prepare them for a better life, by supporting their educational path and ensuring they are granted quality education.

The African Community School operates with the following goals:

- Teaching all subjects according to the Sudanese educational curriculum. - Reducing the burden on parents who fail to pay tuition fees so that students can sit for the exams for the foundation certificate and the Sudanese secondary certificate, which helps them to join universities and higher institutes.

- Provide job opportunities for young Sudanese people and adults who have qualifications and did not have suitable job opportunities in Cairo, as the school provides job opportunities for 26 teachers and 2 workers.











During 2023 POP supported the Sudanese school as follows:

- 1. Payment of tuition fees for those incapable, this is around %60 of the total number of enrolled students
- 2. Renovation of the school building, this included painting the whole school from inside, changing floor tiles in some classes that were broken, and renovated all school desks
- 3. Purchasing new desks, fans and water cooler machine
- 4. Distributing school bags to all students enrolled for the academic year 2024/2023
- The school currently has 369 students enrolled in the school year 2024/2023.

The Papal Office for Projects under the directions of His Holiness Pope Tawadros is always keen to provide the refugees children not just education but also mental care and support. Accordingly during the summer vacation a carnival was held for the school primary stage, 165 child attended this day were they had an opportunity to practice drawing, painting, playing games and watching puppet theater. And also a fun day was held for the preparatory and secondary stages inside the school. These carnivals have played a great role in boosting the children psychologically, during the difficult time they are facing, where they had to leave their country, due to the ongoing conflict.

Further POP also cares for the health of these students and periodical medical checkup is provided to them.

C- St. Mary Church for Primary and Secondary Education in Burundi

St. Mary Technical Primary and Secondary School was established in Burundi at Ruigi Governorate, which is about 160 km from the capital, a governorate where there are no technical secondary schools, and is in high demand. Similar to the Refugees school, POP established this school to help reduce inequality within and among countries, as well as promote peaceful and inclusive societies for sustainable development, provide access to justice for all and build effective accountable and inclusive institutions at all levels.

Since the school started operation in 2021, it has been taking care of the students enrolled, not only academically through providing them high quality technical education that will open doors for them in the job market, but also mental and physical support. The school provides a daily hot lunch meal to all students, medical check up and fun activities.

Today the school has a total number of 238 students enrolled: 130 girls and 108 boys.

The school has three technical departments:

- Information technology
- Communication Technology
- Network and Computer Maintenance

The duration of study for each section is 3 years, after which the student obtains a secondary certificate that qualifies him/her to join university education.

D- Languages Program

1. Summer Languages Program for English and French

Since 2011, POP has been concerned with the language skills of the Egyptian students, as with today's globalization languages became a necessity. The language summer program has been running with offline and online classes for both English & French languages.

In summer 2023, a total of 521 students benefited from this program: 382 students have been enrolled in the English classes and 139 students in the French classes.







2. German Language for nuns, priests and Seminary students. In 2022, and in collaboration with the GOETHE Institute Cairo, POP promoted the learning of the German language, through which participants will be more capable to communicate and interact with German speakers. In 6,2023 have continued in the advanced level for the German language courses.

POP is currently studying the possibility of adding the German language to the summer language program.

E- Eyon Misr Child Creativity Center

Since 2020 a child center has been running in a rural area in Cairo operating with the following core values:

- Allow children to enjoy their childhood and prepare them to become dependable adults •
- Child development and learning, recognizing each child's talents and working with them • to improve
- Ensure children are aware of their dignity and their value in the society, each of them ٠ has a unique value the society is in need for.
- Monitor their health and ensure they have periodical medical checkups. ٠

The center offers the children and youth in the area the following services:

- Children and teenagers library. •
- Language and computer learning programs.
- Talents development programs (Arts, music, handcrafts..).
- Sports activities
- Summer educational and health awareness sessions.

During 2023, the center opened its doors to 186 children ages ranging from (18-6) as well as the Summer Languages Program classes that was held inside this center. The activities are running successfully

F- Scholarships



POP has been offering scholarship opportunities to Egyptian students since 2017. Scholarships provide an opportunity for students to earn an education they need in order to enter the workforce and become a contributing member of society. During 2023, through POP a total number of 20 Egyptian students received scholarships in different fields, 14 students got enrolled at the Russian Universities while 6 students got enrolled at the Hungarian Universities.

Since 2017 and up to date 78 students have been granted scholarships.

Success Story shows how the scholarships made a big difference in the career of the students:

- A very successful student got into an accident in the last day of her high school exams and she was hospitalized for almost 4 months, she missed the universities registration and enrollment in this year, Moreover, her family living conditions didn't allow her to travel and study abroad and she missed a whole study year staying at home with a very deep depression.
- Through the POP, this girl has successfully registered and got accepted at one of the Russian Universities and is currently studying General Medicine.

G- Youth Technical Training Program:

Technical skills today in Egypt play a vital role in driving economic growth and development, bridging the skills gap in the workforce, and empowering individuals from disadvantaged backgrounds.

Therefore, POP over the past year has been focusing on promoting technical education, and encouraging students to get enrolled at technical schools. Various workshop sessions have been held to provide individuals with the skills and knowledge needed to work in specific fields and industries, which can lead to immediate employment opportunities and higher earning potential. During 2023, POP held six Awareness Sessions about the importance of technical education, to raise awareness among parents and students about the importance of vocational education and its future prospects, highlighting the diverse career paths and job opportunities available to graduates of technical programs.

This in addition to a workshop held by the Papal Office in collaboration with the Coptic Social Foundation for Development (EGYCOPT). This workshop was launched to promote vocational training among the children in preparatory stage aging 15 - 14 years old under the name of "Self-discovery and awareness of the importance of technical education and the most important future fields."

The methods of learning and training were through interactive activities with the presentation of visual content for the student to discover himself and his abilities. Technical skills activities were implemented for the following professions: "Refrigeration and air conditioning, Electricity, and automotive mechanics and electricity." 21 students participated in this workshop.





Lastly during 2023, on November 11th, the Papal office for projects arranged a child day under the name "I'm son of Egypt" with the slogan "Egyptian child development is the basis for Egyptian family development". This was a cultural day targeting children between the age 13 to 16, a total of 237 boys and girls have participated, they received various technical skills workshops throughout the day, as well as a meal and small gift. The workshops where very successful, as many of these children stated that they had no intention to go to a technical school, but after these workshops they are considering technical education, others stated they found it more interesting than high school.

We are planning early 2024 during the mid year break to hold a 4 days camp with a more comprehensive serial of technical workshops and include in the program a site visit to a technical school as well as a site visit to one or more technical manufactory/ plant.





Success story:

- "I learned new things about how to achieve my goals and technically I learned a lot of things which I never heard about before and discovered that car mechanics is so interesting." (Student)

H- Awareness Sessions

The Papal Office for Projects believes it has a role towards the community in raising the awareness level of every person we can reach out to.

The aim of our awareness sessions is to increase concern, informing the targeted audience, creating a positive image, and the ultimate aim of such sessions is to achieve long-term lasting behavioral changes



During 2023, POP has held 3 initiatives/awareness sessions as follows:

1st session:

«Women»s development for community development»

In Egypt we celebrate on the 21st of March, Mother's Day, the Papal Office for Projects, in cooperation with the National Council for Women, Cairo Branch, organized a celebration to honor Egyptian women and their tangible role in the society.

His Holiness Pope Tawadros II toured the exhibition that was set as part of this celebration, where an opportunity was given to all the women supported by the Papal Office for projects to display their products as well as sell. Their products where of high quality and they managed to sell a good quantity.

The day also included a session about financial inclusion with the aim of supporting women in light of the difficult global economic conditions followed by a medical session to raise awareness among women about the importance of periodic medical checkups and the necessity of early detection, as well as proper nutrition to maintain a good health.

Then Dr. Jacqueline Azar, Deputy Governor of Alexandria spoke about the importance of the societal role of women and how to have an effective role in the Egyptian society.

While H.G. Bishop Axios spoke about the tangible role of women today in society, encouraging women to have an effective role in their local communities.

At the end of the celebration, a number of women who presented examples of struggle and success were honored.

POP had a medical convoy that day and all participating women where encouraged to visit and receive the necessary medical checkup. The convoy included dental, ophthalmology, internal medicine, and women's clinics as well as the early dedication of breast cancer.

120 women attended the celebration and awareness session, in addition to many more women visited the medical convoy and a big number of people visited the exhibition.









2nd Session:

Importance of Technical Education

The POP held six Awareness Sessions during 2023 about the importance of Technical Education to raise awareness among parents about the importance of vocational education and its future prospects, highlighting the diverse career paths and job opportunities available to graduates of technical programs.

598 parents and 21 students attended these sessions





3rd Session:

Initiative "Devotion to my Health ... Devotion to my Country

On the sidelines of the Presidential initiative "100 Days of Heath" and the National Council for Women campaign "devotion to my Country", the POP held this initiative in collaboration with the Ministry of Health and the National Council for Women where Dr. Mona Khalifa, Director of the Public Health Initiatives Unit in the Office of the Assistant Minister of Health talked about the presidential initiatives launched by the Ministry of Health, and spoke about the government's concerns with the health of citizens and the services that every citizen can benefit from.

> As well, the journalist Nashwa Al-Hofi gave a lecture as part of the National Council f or Women's campaign, where she raised women's awareness about their role towards their country.

> A medical convoy was present with all specialties within the presidential initiative 100 Days of Health, at St. Mark's Cathedral in Abbasiya included the specializations of family planning, women's health, and early detection of breast cancer, as the Ministry provided a mobile vehicle to provide the mammogram service free of charge.

The number of women who benefited from the initiative's services throughout the day reached 328 women.

At the end of the day, the women attended the sessions have been gifted a small environmentally friendly bag bearing the slogan of the day. This bag was produced by the women supported by the Papal Office for Projects, who where trained to sew and where provided a sewing machine and necessary material to operate their own small business, in support to them we give them orders and try to market their products whenever we can.









4th Session:

Finding Solutions to Plastic Pollution

On the World Environment Day 5th June 2023, The POP with cooperation with the National Council for women and Eye of Environment Association has held an awareness session under the name of «Finding Solutions to Plastic Pollution»

During the session, Dr. Rania Abu Nema, General Director of the Eye of Environment Association presented a briefing about the association and their activities in the field of preserving the environment, then she made a detailed presentation on the risks of plastic on the human being, animals and the environment and also Dr. Rania talked about the proposed solutions to reduce the use of plastic, including:

- Avoid single-use plastic materials such as plastic water bottles and grocery bags.

- While shopping use reusable bags for the store (paper and cloth).
- Use reusable water bottle

- Donate unused plastic for recycling. This helps to ensure proper disposal of plastics.

- Aware others on the benefits of reducing plastic usage.

A total of 86 women and men attended the session.



5th Session: POP participation at Logos Coptic Youth Forum Service Week «The role of the Coptic Orthodox Church in sustainable development – women empowerment"»

The aim of the LYF Service week is to get our youth aware of the SDGs and of the importance of their role towards the society. During this week the youth received various lectures of the different SDGs and how the church serves through these goals, while also implementing this practically through servicing the community.

The POP participated with an awareness session about the role of the Coptic Orthodox Church in sustainable development mainly concentrating on Women empowerment and women rights and sharing success stories of our office implemented small income generating projects and how this changed the lives of many women.

The number of youth attended the session are 198 youth girls and boys.

KIMI Program for health enhancement

Since the establishment of POP, there has been a clear vision in its support of health care provision in Egypt. The vision is to go beyond building health care facilities. Its vision is to provide the highest standards in health service and support the most vulnerable groups.

"KIMI" is a Coptic word meaning Egypt. This name was chosen to emphasize the role of our health program in serving all Egyptians.



1) Renovation of Al Karma Clinics in Alexandria

The clinics are located in Zawaida area, the Montazah 1st district in Alexandria, is very well known with its high population density. The people of the region suffer from extreme poverty. The renovation was finished by October 2023 and now we are furnishing the clinics and expected to start operation by April 2024, to provide its services to the neighborhood and offer job opportunities.

The clinics will provide the following medical services:

- Integrated lab.
- X-ray
- Gynaecology clinic.
- Pediatrics Clinic.
- Dental Clinic.
- Internal medicine clinic.
- Ophthalmology clinic.

As well as it will provide job opportunities for many people in the area. Until the Ministry of Health licenses are obtained and we start operation. The place is currently used in collaboration with the Ministry of Health to implement and provide the ministry's different initiatives and provide the related health services.











2) Mental Health Support

In 2023, The Papal Office for Projects has signed an agreement with Fahim Foundation for mental health support with the Presence of His Holiness Pope Tawadros II.

The Foundation aims to spread the culture of mental health and increase community awareness for families about the necessary needs of the psychological patient and the possibility of treating him and integrating him into society, through holding seminars and workshops on the importance of awareness of the seriousness of mental illness.

The POP has assisted in sending blankets to the children of Al Abbasiya Mental Health Hospital through a big carnival made for them. Those children have been exposed to psychological trauma and have behavioral problems.

We are planning in 2024 in collaboration with Fahim foundation to hold a number of awareness sessions for the parents who have special needs children to support them, and help them better deal with their children and understand their needs.











3) Medical Convoys for Egyptians

In cooperation with the Ministry of Health, the POP has held 4 medical convoys with all specialties within the presidential initiative 100 Days of Health at St. Mark's Cathedral in Abbasiya.

The convoy included the following specializations: - Family planning, reproductive health and women's health. -Earlydetection of breast cancer, as the Ministry provided a mobile vehicle to provide the mammogram service free of charge.

- ophthalmology
- Internal Medicine
- Dentistry

As well as a mini pharmacy for some medications for the patients if needed. Total number of beneficiaries: 448 women and 195 child





Statements of appreciation:

- "Without the mammogram, I wouldn't have known that I have benign tumor" Nadia, 42 years
- I was not planning to take any birth control, but the family planning convoy, explained to me its importance and they gave me the suitable birth control free of charge, Eman 31 years
- I have been feeling weak for many months but never thought to see a doctor, at the medical convoy held at the Cathedral, I was diagnosed with Anemia and was given the medication free of charge, Maria 17 years

4) Medical Convoy for Sudanese Refugees Students in Egypt

The POP has organized a medical convey for the Sudanese students. The medical convey included internal medicine and dentistry. A total number of 361 students received the medical checkup this day.

Statements of appreciation:

- "My teeth always burts me and my parents cannot afford to pay for the dentist to check my teeth. Through the medical convoy offered to us through the Pope's office, they treated my tooth decay and finally no pain." A Sudanese refugee student, 11 years old.

Rakoty Program for Institutional Capacity Building

Coptic identity and the institutional support of the Church

Rakoty is the old name of the city of Alexandria, in which the first worldwide Theological institute was founded in the 2nd century. During 2023 the Papal Office for Projects continued supporting the clergy and church leaders & servants to enhance their skills in management, governance, strategic planning, digital communication, community development, crisis management and many more, through the Coptic Institute for church Administration & Development (COPTICAD)

During 2023 the following has been achieved:

1) A total number of 314 (198 priests and monks + 116 church leaders and servants) attended the General Basic Course from different dioceses inside and outside Egypt.

2) A total number of 20 priests attended the specialized training course about the "Strategic thinking skills of Christian Leader" from Alexandria Diocese

3) A total of 121 senior students from the theological school in Cairo attended the "Service Management System" course

4) Also general awareness sessions were held for example;

- "The role of the church council in the administrative management of the church: why - how it works - how it succeeds" for churches' councils of Central Cairo churches.

- "The Method of Christ in Managing Service" for the priests of Samalout, Minya diocese.

- "The priest's wife and areas of administration" were 30 priests' wives attended from Tanta Diocese.

- «Leadership in institutional work» from the leadership preparation program in Alexandria.

St. Mark Aid Program For Humanitarian Aid

The Papal Office for Projects has been supporting Humanitarian aid since 2020 with the start of Covid19pandemic, further the ongoing wars and climate crises are producing a downward spiral effect on the world economy.

Humanitarian aid serves as a lifeline for hundreds of people facing crises, offering the most vulnerable the basic needs such as food and nutrition, shelter, healthcare and promote empowerment, self-reliance and community development.

In 2023, the Papal Office for Projects has supported the following:

- 1) Income Generating Projects.
- 2) Animal Production project
- 3) Youth recovered from addicts project: Animal production and cheese & yogurt manufacturing
- 4) Teach and Educate initiative.
- 5) Distribution of dry food monthly boxes.
- 6) Supporting the Sudanese refugees



1) Income Generating Projects

The Papal Office for Projects helped to implement small income generating projects to empower widows, women and youth to alleviate poverty, improve the wellbeing of communities; and promote empowerment, self-reliance and community development.

In 2023, the Papal Office for Projects implemented a number of 289 of small income generating projects. The projects are implemented as per the conditions of each person that differs from one to another, for example some widows cannot leave their homes and children and accordingly as per her skills a project is tailored for her to work from home.

A total number of 303 widows, women and youth have a monthly income and their own means of living through these projects.

Following is a brief description of the projects implemented during 2023:

A) Sewing machines

This year, we provided a sewing training course to 100 Christian poor women/widows in the Dessert area. In this training, beneficiaries learned and developed skills in making shirts, trousers, skirts, school uniforms, bags and bed sheets.

The most talented 51 women have been granted a sewing machine at their homes to start their business which gave them a daily income to support their families.

The POP not only purchased the machines for them but also markets for their products and give them orders throughout the year, in order to support the operation of their small business.



Statements of appreciation:

- Mousbira, 37 years old said: "My busband was willing to drop off my daughter from going to school in order to save the school expenses. While by this project I am now capable to pay the school fees for my daughter, I feel that I saved my children and provided them a secured future."
- Soaad, 43 years old "a widow": "After my husband passed away, I was trying to find a job but I failed due to lack of skills. POP offered me the sewing course training, and afterwards they gave me a sewing machine to start to sew from my home as well as to take care of my children. They also send me orders for manufacturing products requested from different suppliers. Thank you papa Tawadros"

B) Mobile Kiosk

A total number of 19 mobile "moving" Kiosks have been established. The Mobile "Moving" Kiosks are more like street vendors, they don't have a specific location, they pick and choose the locations by themselves where many consumers are located. They target selling in front of schools, clubs, churches and transportation stations while some of them managed to make a deal with permanent kiosks and grocery stores to take their products.

The main products they sell are chocolates, candies, biscuits as well as homemade cookies and cake. The Papal Office for Projects has also trained a number of women to bake cake and cookies at home and then sell to the mobile kiosks to give them a source of income. The mobile kiosks then sell to consumers and make profit.



Statements of appreciation:

• Essam, 29 years old: "Before, I used to ask my church for support to get my mother's monthly medication, now through this basic project I can afford to purchase the medicine while fulfilling the needs of my family."

C) Goat breading

The Papal Office for Projects have supported 28 widows with 4 goats for their goat breeding project. Six of them are already having 2 or 3 goats and they were in need to expand their project and the others are starting their projects with the 4 goats. The widows are raising the goat on the roof of their houses or in the ground floor.

They bought the goat at the age of 6 to 8 months and feed them for a whole year, then after the year they sell it by kilo or by goat.

Through this year they are gaining their income from the milk of the goat. These widows were very poor and now they are very grateful to God with the support they gain to start supporting their families.

Statements of appreciation:

• Wadea, 51 years old: "I feel the hands of Jesus in my life with this project."



D) Selling vegetables and Fruits

POP implemented this project to 45 widows, these women were in deep need for a source of income to help them to raise their children, they chose the most populated locations were no nearby other vegetables and fruits sellers.

Some of them implemented the projects in front of their houses.



Statements of appreciation:

- Fawzya, 39 years old: "I am very thankful to the Pope's office because of the support I received to start my project, now I am able to continue the education of my children."
- Aksany, 47 years old: "My elder son is a special need and after the death of my busband no one assisted me in our monthly expenses, thank you Saydna for giving me the opportunity to endure the needs of my family and saving my dignity."

E) Selling online Accessories

The POP supported 15 women selling online Accessories.

They target wide segments of customers: women, men, children and babies.

They post online different factories and companies' accessories as: different types of bags, various shoes (sports shoes, sandals, women shoes with different models), jewelry (bracelets, earrings, necklaces, rings, hair pins, bands, hair clips), children toys, Kitchen accessories and cosmetics.

POP pays for their first few orders, and then they proceed with the profit they make.

Statements of appreciation:

• Treaza, a single mother for 2 girls: "My dream to take more and more to educate my daughters and after they grow up, they will assist me."





F) Selling shoes and slippers

POP offered this project to 16 women mainly widows; they either have space at their home or have a store to display the goods that we purchased for them. They start growing step by step through the profit they gain; they manage to buy more products.

All these widows had no source of income at all, and the church was giving them a monthly allowance. Today they no longer receive financial support from the church and are managing to support the children needs and have become financially independent.

G) Selling clothes

POP offered this project to 18 women; they either have space at their home or have a store to display the goods that we purchased for them. They start growing step by step through the profit they gain; they manage to buy more products. They sell cloth for women, men, babies and toddlers.



Statements of appreciation:

- An 8 years old boy told his father who purchased a filter "The water tastes much better now, I used to hate drinking water before"
- Mina, 35 years old: "I feel the Bible verse when Jesus said "Ask and it will be given to you." A week before taking the project grant I was crying in the church asking God for his favour to help me in my time of need to find a job and He replied to me through the Papal office granting me this project, that I consider a source of life"

H) Selling water filters and spare parts

The Papal Office for projects have supported 4 water filters projects for youth.

All of the youth are aware of plumbing work. The villages where these projects have been implemented at have unclean water; therefore filtered water for drinking is in high demand, to protect their lives. From this perspective, we supported this project not just to provide a means of living but also to save the lives and protect the health of the village residences.



I) Selling Car batteries

The Papal Office for projects has supported 7 car batteries projects for youth. All of the youth have had an experience in car workshops and have the knowhow of repairing damaged batteries and even manufacturing car batteries.

Statements of appreciation:

• Nagy, 26 years old: "I live with my widowed mother, our house got destroyed and we have been staying since then at my uncle's house. Today with the income I make I managed to rent a room where me and my mother live in peacefully."





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J) Grocery shops and Fawry machines

The Papal Office for Projects offered 21 grocery shops to women and youth

The beneficiaries are having the space whether inside their home or a store and we provided them with the grocery goods as a start, then from the profit they buy more goods and expand.

They ensure that they have a wide variety of products available at all times. Also, The Grocery shops has Fawry service to pay electricity, gas and mobile phone bills.



Statements of appreciation:

- Asbraf, a grocery owner his mother and father are dead and he has a sister who is supposed to be married in January 2024. She wasn't able to buy all of her cloth, curtains and carpets as the church already assisted in the furniture.
- While Ashraf is assisting his sister with all her missing supplies and this make them feel their dignity that instead of borrowing money from their neighbors, friends or family, they managed to buy their needs.

K) Tools and Machines for small Carpentry workshops

The Papal Office for Projects offered tools and machines for 5 carpentry workshops.

The selected youth that we supported already have the basic tools but to help them take bigger orders and become independent and have a good source of income we provided them with more tools/machines as per their need to expand and grow.

Each workshop serves the village located in by manufacturing reasonably priced furniture for the people as well as any request from the churches. Before, they were producing small products as doors, windows, desks, wooden medals, while now with the expansion of their workshop they can produce heavier furniture as; chairs, cupboards, beds and so on



Statements of appreciation:

• Sami 33 years old: "We couldn't send my daughter to school every day, due to the transportation cost that I couldn't afford, today with this expansion at work, I'm receiving more orders and making more profit and my daughter goes to school everyday"

L) A steam car wash machine

The POP has supported 2 youth with this project.

Both projects are located in inhabited areas and occupied by cars. they wash all types of vehicles; cars, motorcycles, buses and microbuses, three wheels motor cycle.



Statements of appreciation:

• Mina, 24 years old: "without this project, and with the current enormous increase in prices, I wouldn't have managed to buy the rest of the furniture in order to get married as planned winter 2024."

M) Herbal shops

The POP assisted 21 widows with small herbal shops.

The herbal shop project is a good idea, as people are always in need to buy all kinds of spices and herbs from one place.





Statements of appreciation:

• Afaf, 42 years, widow: "Before this project I has no means of living and depended on the church on all expenses, this my 18 years old daughter didn't like and always felt embarrassed, as well as I couldn't fulfill all her needs. Today, through this project we live with dignity and my daughter is proud of me, and all ber needs are fulfilled"

N) Three wheel Motor cycles

The Papal Office for Projects purchased 12 three wheels motorcycles used but in very good condition. These offered job opportunities for 24 youth as every 2 youth share one tricycle; one works the morning shift and the second in the evening shift.

The three-wheeled motorcycles are mainly used in Egypt villages as a source of transportation for products and goods. The youth working on these tricycles have become known in their villages and people ask them to transfer goods and personal belongings, as food products, household items, building materials and small machines.



Success story:

• Kirolos one of the youth who works the evening shift, was engaged for sometime and couldn't marry due to his low income from his morning job and could not manage to buy all the house needs for marriage, today with the income be makes, he has set a monthly plan to buy the missing items and plans to get married next summer.

O) Tuktuk

The Papal Office for projects have supported 4 youth with 2 tuktuks as 2 youth are working on each tuktuk, one in the morning shift and other in the evening shift.

Tuktuk is the main source of transportation in the villages and it is of high demand. They work around 17 hours a day, morning and night to transfer people within the village.

Statement of appreciation:

• Naguib, 30 years old: "I have one son 7 years old and recently God granted me 2 twin girls, the expenses has increased and my salary wasn't enough to cover all the needs. So, the additional job I got in the evening shift on the tuktuk helped me a lot to fulfill my family needs."



P) Women hairdresser Salon

The Papal Office for Projects assisted 4 women who had the experience, to set their own hairdresser saloon, POP purchased them the requested tools, today they successfully manage their salons in their villages that had no women salons before.

Statements of appreciation:

3 times a week, however we managed to send him only once a week due to lack of funds. Therefore I decided to help my husband and the Papal office assisted me with this project as I used to work before marriage at a bairdresser and bad the know-bow. Today we manage to send our child for all the sessions needed"

• Amira, 41 years old: "I have 2 children, one of them is a special needs, he needs speech and sensory sessions

Q) Selling stationary and photocopier

POP has supported 16 stationary and photocopier projects to widows and youth.

All of the 16 projects are located at locations where a large number of targeted customers are located; near universities, schools, educational centers and government offices with high demand for a nearby photocopier to make copies of their studies, projects when needed





Statements of appreciation:

• Nadia, a widow 44 years old: "I have a girl 18 years old, she is engaged and about to get married. The monthly income of this project will belp me a lot in purchasing my daughter's bridal needs. Thank you Pope Tawadros for not leaving us"

2) "Animal Production" project in Behira Diocese

The POP has supported this project with 5 calves as a start. Then, the farmer follows a 6 months nutritional "feeding" program to raise these calves, to reach 500 KG each.

Then he sells them and with the profit he buys more calves to expand. This project also serves 150 needy families in the nearby churches by giving them 1 kilo meat quarterly.

This project is currently providing a job opportunity for 1 farmer and by expansion it will provide job opportunities to two more farmers.



3) Youth recovered from addicts project: Animal production and cheese & yogurt manufacturing

This project is to support 10 youth recovered from addiction, they were in need for motivation, stability and gain their own means of living, while being under the supervision of the church to ensure they do not return to the addiction.

The POP has supported this project with 10 cows. This project is for milk and cheese production, as each cow produce daily around 35 KG of milk, they sell them as milk or manufactured cheese to the nearby markets and church markets.

The project also supports 42 needy families of the church with the milk they need for their children.

Statements of appreciation:

• Nabil, 43 years old: "After the long recovery journey I've been through, I have never imagined that Pope Tawadros."

4) Teach and Educate Initiative

Through the past years, the Papal Office for projects provided sewing training courses to a total of 321 poor women; beneficiaries learned and developed skills in making shirts, trousers, skirts, school uniforms, bags and bed sheets.

The most talented women have been given a sewing machine at their homes to start their business through which they gain a daily income, most of these women are widows and the income made helps them a lot in raising their children.

This year, the POP has launched the initiative "Teach and Educate" where the women we trained and have been given a sewing machine, have been given an order to manufacture school bags, this was a great source of income for them, and they managed to produce 2500 handmade school bags, POP distributed these bags to 12 government schools in different slum areas as a support from the POP to help the parents in the school supplies needed to educate their children.

5) Distribution of dry food monthly boxes:

Hunger is getting worse worldwide, over %10 of the global population, regularly go to bed hungry. Economic shocks, extreme weather events, conflicts and wars have restricted global food supplies. This has driven up prices and presented threat to vulnerable populations and countries. In Egypt today we are facing shortage of many basic food items leading to enormous increase in prices. This the vulnerable families cannot afford, and all of the families supported by POP used to go to bed hungry.

Further over %40 of Egyptian children have anemia due to poor nutrition, and at POP we consider we have to support the needs of the children and ensure they get a balance meal to avoid any future health issues.

Therefore, on a monthly basis, the Papal Office for projects has been supporting thousands of vulnerable families "mainly widows" who have lost their means of living, can't work due a specific condition, or have a small means of living that isn't sufficient due to the current high inflation rate. We therefore give them hand by delivering them a monthly dry food nutritional box along with fruits and meat or chicken, or fish (varies each month) to boost their immunity system, and ensure they don't go to bed hungry.



Statement of appreciation from the widows served:

- Without the cheese pack we receive every month I won>t have managed to send my children to school, as I won>t have managed to afford school sandwiches everyday. You are not just feeding us but also supporting my children education.
- Vegetables and fruits prices are very high and with my minimal income I would have never managed to provide my children their needs at this age to grow healthy, thank you for taking care of us
- Before receiving from the Papal Office the monthly food box, I used to buy one chicken for my children every four months, today on a monthly basis my children get to eat a chicken or meat or fish, thank you.













6) Supporting the Sudanese refuges "Emergency"

Due to the current situation in Sudan which led to the death and injury of thousands of Sudanese, and forced hundreds of thousands of people to leave their homes and evacuate to nearby neighboring countries, especially Egypt who is doing the best efforts to receive and protect Sudanese refugees who are in dire need for safety and help.

Therefore; The Coptic Orthodox church has opened its doors to the Christian Sudanese who arrived Egypt.

The Papal Office for projects supported 800 families, 25 priests and their families and 6 church deacons with their families with monthly financial assistance, house rent, and assistance in their children's education as well as distributing food, towels, blankets and cloth.

These families POP will continue to support until they find jobs in Egypt and have their own means of living

POP is committed to fight poverty and hunger 2. Work towards limiting the impacts of climate change and promoting climate justice while fostering the achievements of global climate goals. POP is committed to ensure climate protection in all our projects to be executed, and promote among our beneficiaries their role in protecting the environment.

3. Women empowerment and strengthening their social position

Many women are structurally disadvantaged and discriminated against in nearly all areas of life. In many places, they have no access to education, careers or social participation and are unable to exercise their rights for themselves. Around the world, women are suffering in greater numbers and more systematically from sexualised and gender-based violence. Many women and girls are excluded from their communities and driven into poverty. POP is committed to continue empowering women and granting them their full rights.

4. Focus on educational enhancements through innovations in education for sustainable development, digital transformation and academic integrity, while ensuring that learning opportunities are granted to everyone. Further POP will give more focus to technical education and promote its importance and need in the society today.

5. Focus on health enhancements - Ensure that everyone benefits from health services they need in good quality and without financial hardship. Supporting the Misnitry of Health presidential campaigns and initiatives, with great focus on the first 1000 days after birth, and family control.

2024 New Initiatives

1000 Golden Days Presidential Initiative - in collaboration with the Ministry of health, aiming "towards Optimal Solution to the population issue" with a particular focus on the critical first 1000 days of a child's life and the promotion of safe vaginal deliveries. POP will work on this initiative by holding a number of awareness sessions for doctors and nurses at the church owned hospitals and clinics, training healthcare professionals on primary care, obstetric care reviving midwifery services and neonatal care services, and practices related to childbirth and early childhood development. Also awareness sessions will be held for women on family planning & the importance of breastfeeding. As well as TOT Building capacity for Counselors' servants, Youth servants and Women servants "Initiative Ambassadors" to promote for the new concept and change the behavior

Threads of Hope initiative - providing sustainable dignified work for Sudanese refugees, targeting 120 Sudanese refugees.

Free to Feed - Cooking classes for refugees and distributing the food among them.

To respect their dignity, cooking classes will be offered to Sudanese women, and a healthy meal that they cook will be given to her and her family members, to ensure they get a weekly nutritionally balanced meal, along with milk and dairy products. Targeting 100 families on a weekly basis.

Healthy generation - To boost children and teenagers health, a monthly nutritional box will be provided to the needy children POP serves. Targeting 300 children monthly.

Second Chance initiative - Technical Skills training for youth dropped off school, targeting 200 youth – training programs will include mobile repair, AC maintenance, sewing classes, hair care/salon and caring for elderlies

Our Youth = Our Future - Involve youth in the community, through various activities with the Ministry of Youth, through which they will be trained and receive awareness sessions to gain new skills. Targeting 200 youth.

Educate to empower - Small income generating projects for widows and youth, expecting to empower 220 widows and 80 youth

Empower to Educate - Distribute school bags and school classroom desks manufactured through our trained and empowered women and men. Give a hand- Distributing dry food boxes to the most vulnerable, 5000 boxes to be distributed monthly

Women leads program - To enhance the capabilities, knowledge and skills of women, in order to avail opportunities for them in the market to secure their economic well-being, find better job opportunities and get them involved in community social work in line with the Egyptian state's vision 2030. Targeting 180 women. **I'm different not less** - Skills educational school for the disabled at lower Egypt, Al Nahda village. Targeting to enroll 120 students.

Be wise - to educate women on how to manage their homes, spend wisely and save better, awareness of financial inclusion, through speakers from the central bank of Egypt. Targeting 150 women,

Select wisely - Awareness of danger of early marriage and marriage of relatives. To minimize inherited diseases and ensure a successful happy marriage. Targeting 250 persons.

Share the joy of Christmas - Christmas carnival for the children in slum areas, to see and feel the joy of Christmas, as well as a bazar for POP empowered women to sell their products. Targeting 250 children & 25 women.

Events:

March 2024 - Women conference to encourage the empowerment of women and share success stories. As well as honor the successfully empowered women.

June 2024 - 10 years of the establishment of the first Eyon Misr School & launching the general secretariat for the Coptic Orthodox Church schools.
